

# Waivers And Continuations Reduce Size Of Large Warren District Court Docket

Eighty cases originally set for trial Friday in Warren County District Court shrank to 56 before the session ended as 16 continuations and eight waivers reduced the number heard.

Judge Julius Banzet of Warrenton presided over the session in which the following cases were disposed of:

Bobby Gene Alexander, trespass, voluntary dismissal. On a charge of assault with a deadly weapon, he was found guilty of simple assault and ordered to jail for sixty days, suspended for two years on condition that he not go on premises of Lou Jiggetts for two years, that he keep the peace toward all persons, particularly Lou Jiggetts and that he pay cost of court, including attorney fees.

James Alston, larceny, and assault on female, prosecuting witness called and failed. Capias Ad Testificandum ordered for prosecuting witness and bond set at \$500.

John Arnold, public drunkenness, because defendant has been in jail for six days, case dismissed.

Charlie Alexander Ball, speeding 50 in 35 mph zone, called and failed. Ordered arrested and bond set at \$350.

Robert Bowen, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone and driving under influence, found guilty of driving under influence, ordered to pay fine of \$125 and court costs, surrender operator's license and not operate motor vehicle on highways for 12 months and until he is properly licensed by Department of Motor Vehicles. Voluntary dismissal was taken on speeding charge.

Roy Boyd, Jr., trespass and making annoying phone calls, ordered to jail for 60 days, suspended for two years on condition that he not call the residence of Linda Wright in person or by phone or through any other person, agent or servant and pay cost of court.

Albert Bullock, failure to stop at stop sign and improper equipment - tires - called and failed. Ordered arrested and bond set at \$200. He was also charged with worthless check and no inspection sticker and driving under influence. Bond

was set at \$200 in each case when he did not appear in court.

Willie Burnette, Jr., larceny, found guilty of trespass, court costs.

Willie Dale, Jr., assault on female, ordered to jail for 60 days and assigned to work under the supervision of N.C. Department of Correction suspended if attorney fees are paid.

Earl Davis, using profane, threatening language on phone, not guilty.

Loney Jackson Davis, speeding 90 in 55 mph zone and failure to stop for siren, careless and reckless driving and scratching off, ordered to jail for 60 days, suspended for two years on condition that he surrender his operator's license and not operate motor vehicle on highways for six months, pay cost of court and \$50 for attorney fees.

Henry Floyd Evans, Jr., bastardy, bill of particulars, ordered to pay \$60 to office of Superior Court for support of minor child and case continued under former order.

James Goins, probation violation, ordered that probation be revoked and sentenced to be assigned to work under supervision of Department of Correction for six months to be issued by Clerk of Court.

Albert Hargrove, worthless check, waived formal presentation of evidence and ordered to jail for 60 days, suspended for two years on condition he pay \$143.81 to reimburse Warren Ice & Fuel Co., pay cost of court and \$50 to reimburse for attorney fees. Notice of appeal given to next Criminal Session of Superior Court.

Jake Hargrove, using profane, threatening language over the phone, fined \$25 and court costs.

Bobby Harris, larceny, waived right to preliminary hearing and ordered to appear at next Criminal Session of Superior Court to answer charge with bond to remain in effect.

Idell Harris, trespass, ordered to jail for two years and assigned to work under supervision of N.C. Department of Corrections.

Walter John Hundley, careless and reckless driving, speeding 80 in 55 mph zone and failure to stop for blue light and siren, defendant waived formal presentation of evidence, fined \$150 and court costs. Notice of appeal given to next Criminal Session of Superior Court with bond to remain in effect.

Edward Johnson, obstructing officer, no operator's license, called and failed. Ordered for appearance on April 2 and bond set at \$200.

Cervie Lemont McKinnon, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed. Ordered arrested and bond set at \$350.

Larry Darnell Perry, no operator's license, ordered to jail for 60 days, suspended for two years on condition he not operate motor vehicle on highways until properly licensed by Dept. of Motor Vehicles, ordered to pay \$50 to reimburse attorney fees and court costs.

Craig J. Popadich, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed.

Thomas A. Ragonesi, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed.

Eugene Reed, failure to see safe movement, driving under influence and transporting broken sealed alcoholic beverage, ordered to jail for 60 days, suspended for two years on condition that he not violate any motor vehicle laws of State for two years, not operate vehicle on highways for 12 months, fined \$100 and court costs. Voluntary dismissal taken on broken sealed alcoholic beverage charge.

Douglas Hudgins, nonsupport, ordered to jail for six months and assigned to work under supervision of Department of Correction.
