PROPERTY TAX RELIEF FOR ELDERLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED PERSONS WITH LIMITED INCOME

If you are 65 years of age or older or totally and permanently disabled and your disposable income for the preceding year did not exceed seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500), you are eligible for an exclusion of up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in assessed valuation of the property you own and occupy as your principal residence.
