## Warren Native Is Named New Battalion Commander

A Warren County native is the new battalion commander of the 5th Battalion of the 113th Field Artillery of the North Carolina National Guard.

Lt. Col. Leonard A. Kilian, Jr., formerly of Ridgeway, was picked to succeed Lt. Col. Jack M. Tippet of Zebulon, who has been transferred to the N. C. Adjutant General's staff.

Units of Lt. Col. Kilian's new command are located in Youngsville, Oxford, Eden, Zebulon and Louisburg.

Kilian joined the National Guard in 1958 after serving two years with the seventh Division in Korea. He is a graduate of N. C. State University and was commissioned a second lieutenant prior to his Korean experience.

While a member of the National Guard, he has completed several military schools and is now enrolled in Command and General Staff College of Fort Leavenworth, Kan. He has served at High Point, Whiteville and Fort Bragg and has attended schools at Fort Benning, Ga., and Fort Sill, Okla.
