In 1977 Federal Crop Insurance has increased the coverage on tobacco in both Vance and Warren counties. "If you are interested in learning more about your coverage please contact the local Federal Crop Insurance Office located in the Vance County Office Building in Henderson immediately," Mrs. Buchanan said. "Sales have already been closed in many counties in other areas."
Due to the current funding situation, no Federal Crop Insurance fieldmen will be able to call on individual farmers, she said.
