Forty-three Warren County Extension Homemakers were among the 718 attending the North Central District Annual Extension Homemaker's Day, April 13 at the Jane S. McKimmon Educational Center in Raleigh.

The theme for the day's program was "The Third Century Woman." Mrs. Janice Siler, Department of Pastoral Care, N. C. Baptist Hospitals, Inc., Winston-Salem, highlighted the program when she spoke on the subject "As A Third Century Woman." She said "women in the third century have many choices, many opportunities. It's important to know what time it is in your life, make choice and make commitments. The woman must know where her support system is and who it is. Being faced with many changes, new decisions must be made, so the woman must be responsible." Mrs. Siler stated that husband and wife should communicate and plan together. She mentioned the importance of the extended family, the importance of parenting and mothering. As third century women, we must learn how to reach out to others.
