Warren County District Court

Nonsupport and assault charges took precedence over the usual traffic violations during a short session of Warren County District Court on Friday, Judge Claude W. Allen of Oxford presided over the session. Eleven of the scheduled 27 cases were continued. Cases disposed of included:

Jerry Allen Bolton, nonsupport, voluntary dismissal.

William Caudle, nonsup-

port, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on July 8 without privilege of bond.

Fernell Murray Deloatch, speeding 67 in 55 mph zone, voluntary dismissal.

James Goins, assault on female, ordered to jail for two years, suspended for three years on condition that he pay cost of court, that for six months he not drink any alcoholic beverages and that for two years he not be found guilty of any crime

involving alcohol or any crime involving assault for three years.

Douglass J. Hudgins, larceny, trespass, and communicating threats, upon entering a plea of guilty of misdemeanor larceny, he was ordered to jail for two years, suspended for two years on condition that he not molest, harass, or in any way interfere with the peaceful living of Ann Rappe, that he not go on the premises of any lands owned, occupied by or under the control of Ann Rappe unless he has written permission for a period of two years, and that he make an appointment with the mental health clinic to avail himself of any alcoholic treatment that they may administer to him and that he keep all appointments with the clinic, that he pay into the office of Clerk of Superior Court the cost of court and reimburse the state for attorney fees and \$100 restitution to Ann Rappe. A voluntary dismissal was granted on the trespass and communicating threats charges.

Joseph Meadows, nonsupport, motion allowed for defendant, prosecuting witness and child to have blood tests with case continued for two weeks for tests to be made.

Larry Semedo, breaking, entering and larceny, waived right to preliminary hearing and ordered to appear at next criminal session of Superior Court to answer charge with bond to remain the same.

Jerry Stallings, assault inflicting injury, ordered to jail for 90 days, suspended for 12 months on the condition that he pay fine of \$25 and court costs, pay all medical expenses incurred to Bruce Allen Whitmore and not be found guilty of assault for a period of two years.

Bruce Allen Whitmore, careless and reckless driving, not guilty.

Daniel Williams, Jr., worthless check, called and failed. Ordered arrested for appearance on July 15 with bond set at \$200.

Hervy Tabon vs. Rebecca H. Tabon, absolute divorce granted.

Elnora R. Johnson vs. William Johnson, absolute divorce granted.

Wilma L. Allen vs. Willie Allen, court found that the defendant is of such ill health that he cannot hold a job and ordered the case dismissed.

Elizabeth Powell Harris, speeding 58 in 35 mph zone, found guilty of improper equipment, court cost.

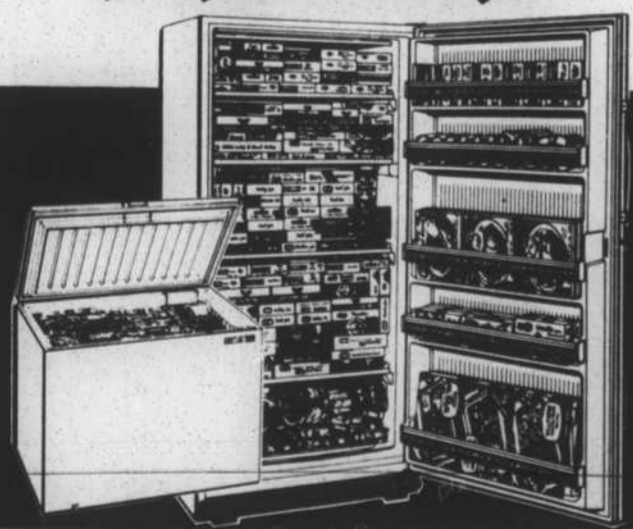
As Warren County chairman Robertson will work with other community leaders in a year-round program to encourage the increased purchase of Savings Bonds at banks and on the payroll savings plan.
