(Continued from page 1) appeared before the commissioners to inform them that a nutritional program requiring a matching fund, had been matched by private donations and would not require any county support at this time.

Mrs. Hight also told the commissioners that she was in search of a house that could be used as a Senior Citizens Center for Warren County. She expressed regret that School Days, the former Allen Home, had been chosen for other uses as it would have made a beautiful Senior Citizens Center that would have been the envy of surrounding counties. She suggested that the old Hawkins home behind Schools Days might be used, but received no encouragement, as she was told that the architect had said it was not repairable.

Mrs. Hight said that Senior Citizens homes would be provided on an 80-20 basis, with the county's share being paid "in kind" and asked the commission-

ers to be on the lookout for a home suitable for a center.

The commissioners certified that the Macon Fire Company is now a regular rural fire company of Warren County and has a membership of 25 members. Certification of a fire company is a part of a rural fire company becoming a fire district member.

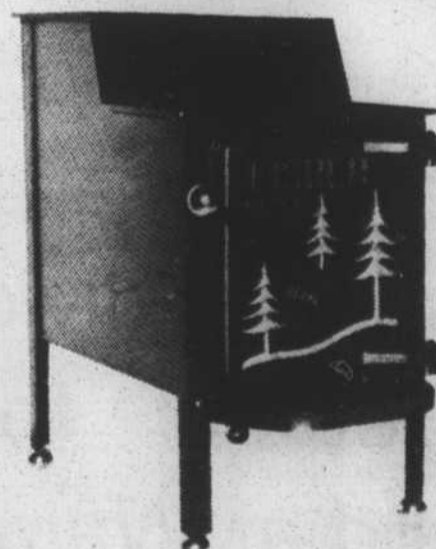
