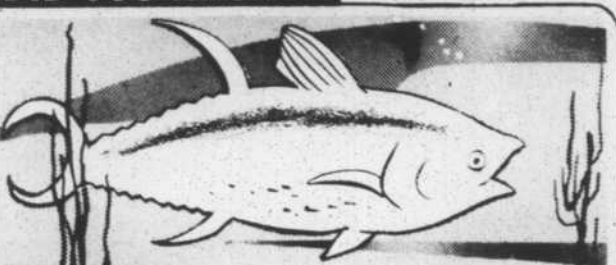

## Use Care In Cleaning Cookware

Cleaning non-stick coated pans used to be easy.

Years ago, before numerous kinds of coatings went on the market, there were also very few cleaning preparations available for home use.

Now, however, there are cleaning solutions available on store shelves that may ruin some coatings, say agricultural extension specialists at North Carolina State University.

It's best to remember that coatings are basically plastic paints and although some are tougher than others, all will scratch if they are not handled with more care than most non-coated cookware.

The best practice is to use plastic utensils whenever possible and to wash the cooking surface after each use with soap or detergent.

Over a period of time, food particles will carbonize, leaving a black deposit which can be difficult to remove and which results in more food sticking.

Some coatings can be cleaned relatively satisfactorily using commercial cleaners and some cannot. Before using any commercial cleaner, consult the instruction manual supplied with the appliance.
