### Multiple Office-Holding Questioned

How many positions of public trust and responsibility can or should one person be permitted to hold at the same time

This question was raised at a recent meeting of the Area Mental Health Board of Vance, Warren, Granville and Franklin counties. Jack Harris, Warren County commissioner, was reelected chairman of the mental health board at that meeting

Harris is currently the chairman of the Warren commissioners as well as the policy board of the Region K Council of Governments. He therefore holds membership on one elective policy board and two appointive boards, and serves as chairman of all three.

Harris also served on the Warren County Board of Social Services from 1978 until July 1, 1980. During this period, he was also a county commissioner, COG board member and a member of the mental health board

The North Carolina Constitution addresses this question in direct fashion. It prohibits a person from holding plore than one elective office or from serving in more than one appointive office in state and local government.

The constitution also prohibits any combination of elective and appointive offices unless the N. C. General Assembly authorizes an exception by general law

The General Assembly has modified the constitutional restrictions on dual office holding by authorizing one person to hold two appointive offices or one elective and one appointive office, with some exceptions. Serving concurrently in three or more public offices appears to be a violation of both the constitution as well as subsequent laws enacted pertaining to public office holding.

Louisburg attorney Larry Norman, a member of the mental health board, said he was familiar with the state statutes in this area. He was asked by Harris to obtain an interpretation from the attorney general's office about the legality of Harris serving simultaneously on three public policy making boards.

The question about multiple office holding can also

be raised in Franklin County. Former commissioner Bruce Honevcutt held appointive positions on the health board and the COG board in addition to his commussioner duties. Robert Lee Swanson served on the social services, library and Franklin-Vance- Warren Opportunity. Inc. while also serving as a

If membership on boards of such non-profit corporations as Franklin-Vance-Warren Opportunity and Region K Senior Services are viewed as "positions of public trust," other commissioners and local citizens may be in violation of state law. Both of the above programs came into existence through local governmental initiative, and are almost totally funded from federal, state or local tax sources
