## For Accuracy And Safety Get Your Gauges Checked

Canning season is just around the corner. Now is the time to check to see if your equipment is ready to use.

Do you own a pressure canner with a clock type gauge? If so it should be checked for accuracy each year. You may have it checked at the Home Economics Extension Agents office in the Warren County Agricultural building, Warrenton. To have the gauge checked bring just the canner lid to the office. There is no charge for testing these gauges.

Following recommended canning practices is very important in having foods that are safe to eat. Knowing the accuracy of your canner gauge is an important factor in the safety of the foods as well as safety in using the canner. The Home Economics Extension Agents office is open from 8:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m. Bring your canner lid by to be tested at your convenience.

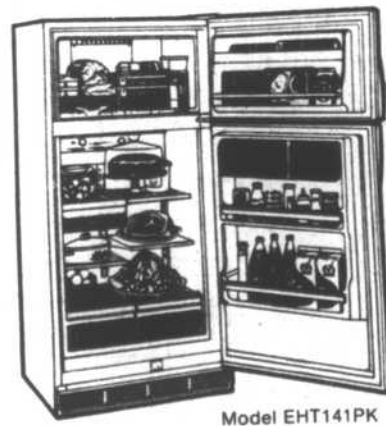
