## State Report Shows Travel, Tourism Receipts Off Here

Warrenton, Ore. (Sept. 13) — Receipts from travel and tourism in Warren County were down 10.5 percent in the first seven months of 1983 compared with the same period last year, according to a report from the Oregon Department of Transportation.

The report, which is based on data from the Oregon State Office of Economic Development, shows that receipts from travel and tourism in Warren County were \$1,100,000 in the first seven months of 1983, compared with \$1,220,000 in the same period last year.
