ning attack, paced by the 145-pound Coley, was the most effective against the Brick Wall this year. The Eagles' offensive line was unable to move Ayden-Grifton the final three quarters of the game after Sammons went out of the lineup.

Greene, playing his final high school game, rushed for 114 yards and finished the season with 1,708 yards rushing and 20 touchdowns. The 194-pound senior averaged more than eight yards per carry this year.

"Ayden was ready for him," noted Frazier, adding, "but Joe was a step away from breaking it five or six times, but they played real good defense."

Frazier also praised the play of senior quarterback Ellington, who stepped in for Randy Garrett in the Eagles' fourth game, and led the Eagles to a 7-1 mark as a starter.

"He's a tremendously smart player," Frazier said of Ellington, adding, "it's almost like having a coach on the field." Ellington, a 193-pounder, entered the game with an impressive 8.1 rushing average.

Defensively for the Eagles the standouts were Stephon Kearney with 17 tackles and John Falcon with 12 stops. Both tackles have had outstanding seasons for WC, leading the

team in tackles. Falcon had 21 tackles in one game this year, while Kearney had 20 tackles in another contest.

While the season ends for the no. 7 Eagles, Ayden-Grifton has the unenviable task of facing Burlington Williams. Williams was a 4-A power before dropping back to 3-A play. The Bulldogs are the defending state 3-A champions and have won 31 straight games.
