## BUDDY'S WORKSHOP

### Flickering Lights Indicate Overload

Every once in a while, the overhead lights will flicker when the washing machine is turned on in the basement. A friend tells me this indicates my house wiring is inadequate. Is he right?  
He is probably right. One or more circuits may be overloaded. This may happen when too many small appliances are in use on a single circuit as radios, vacuum cleaners, hair dryers, etc. are moved from one room to another. You always know that a circuit was overloaded when a fuse is blown. You should suspect overloading when lights flicker, a TV shrinks, or appliances seem to have difficulty starting and run slowly. Have your electrical system checked by a qualified electrician.  
Other than commercial aerosol products, is there an easy way to "unfreeze" frozen locks during wintertime?  
Depending upon the temperature and the amount of moisture that has frozen inside the lock, you may be able to "unfreeze" the lock if you have a cigarette lighter or a match. Simply heat the key a few times and insert it carefully into the lock; turn gently back and forth. This process may need to be repeated several times before the warmth of the key is transmitted to the lock in quantity sufficient to melt the ice inside.
