Fishing Creek became the first precinct to report complete returns when it telephoned its final report at 8:50 p. m. Helping win the traditional counting race were three local residents who tallied votes. They were Willie Mae Richardson, registrar; Purlean Whitley, Republican judge; and Weldon C. Capps, Democratic judge.

Fishing Creek cast 354 ballots during the 13 hours of voting. Nutbush Precinct, where 536 voters went to the polls, was the last of Warren's 14 precincts to report, giving elections officials a final tally at 11:20 p. m.

A total of 263 absentee ballot applications, the most ever, was received by the Warren County Board of Elections. Almost 200 persons voted by this route.
