Agriculturally Speaking

The main secret to keeping a healthy, attractive lawn for a long time is the use of the proper amount of fertilizer at the right time.

In Warren County, the last two weeks of February are ideal for applying a maintenance fertilizer to your yard. Twelve pounds of 12-4-8 per 1,000 square feet is an ideal rate unless your soil sample shows otherwise.

You also need to add about one-half pound of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet to your lawn in April and May. Apply 12 more pounds of 12-4-8 per 1,000 square feet in September.

Fertilizers that contain organic and inorganic nitrogen are best for lawns. The organic nitrogen costs more per unit but has the advantage of releasing its nutrients over a longer period of time.

In North Carolina, research has shown that cool season grasses such as tall fescue require for best growth a ratio of nitrogen, phosphorus; and potash of 4:1:2 over a one-year period.

Remember that you should not apply nitrogen to fescue during the summer. Fescue is in a semi-dormant stage at this time.
