Warren County's Eagles got a split in their two-game conference activity last week.

On April 17 the Eagles erupted for three runs in the third inning and went on to top Southeast Halifax, 3-1, in a Roanoke River Conference road game.

Davis Capps got the win for the locals, striking out 12 and

walking two. Cooper suffered the loss, although he struck out 11 Eagles and walked a pair.

Marvin Harrison, Capps and catcher Franklin Hargrove each had one of Warren's three hits. Southeast managed five hits but could only score once, that in the sixth inning.
