Judge Wilkinson Presides Over Warren Court Session

Judge C. W. Wilkinson, Jr. of Oxford presided over the August 15 session of Warren County District Court, disposing of the following cases:

Cleveland Watson, assault on a female, dismissed by the prosecutor.

Samuel Moore, two counts of worthless checks, called and failed, judgment absolute entered on bonds dated January 7 and March 17, order of forfeiture and order for arrest issued for defendant's appearance on September 12, bond set at \$900 cash.

Robert D. Jones, no driver's license, dismissed by the prosecutor; driving while subject to an impairing substance, ordered confined to jail for not less than or more than 90 days, suspended

for 12 months, with unsupervised probation for 12 months upon the condition that the defendant pay \$100 fine and court costs, complete 72 hours Community Service within 90 days and pay the \$50 fee; attend and complete the Alcohol and Drug Education Traffic School and pay the \$50 fee; not operate a motor vehicle on the highways of N. C. for 12 months.

Marjorie K. Adler, speeding 68 in 55 mph zone, called and failed, 90-day failure, dismissed with leave by the prosecutor.

Mark Lane Wagner, improper passing, called and failed, 90-day failure, dismissed with leave by the prosecutor.

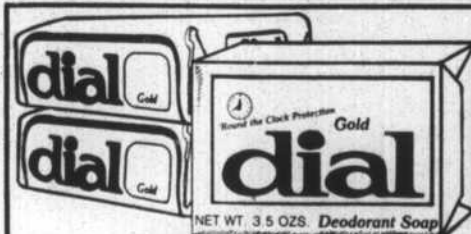

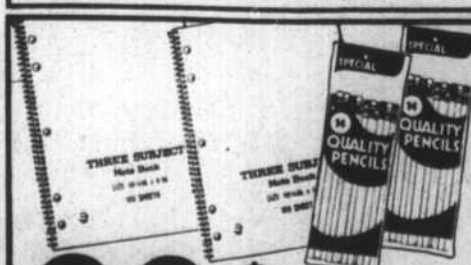
