

Judge Allen Presides Over Session Of District Court

Judge C. W. Allen, Jr. of Oxford presided over the Oct. 3 session of Warren County District Court, disposing of the following cases:

Cleveland Watson, shoplifting - unlawful concealment of goods, ordered to jail for 90 days; defendant, through counsel, gave notice of appeal to the next criminal session of Superior Court; continuing bond.

Steven Leonard Haislip, possession of stolen goods, no probable cause found; case dismissed.

Joseph Alexander Jones, three counts of failure to comply, court ordered probation revoked and sentence activated; defendant, through counsel, gave notice of appeal to next session of Superior Court; continuing bond to remain in effect.

Tony Rollinson, bastardy - non-support of illegitimate child, dismissed by prosecutor.

Sherman Hargrove, worthless check, ordered to jail for 20 days; sentence suspended for 6 months upon condition that defendant pay the amount of the check for the use and benefit of Willoughby's and pay court costs.

Willie D. Hedgepeth, failure to comply, ordered to pay \$50 on date of court and balance within two weeks.

Authur Wayne Davis, failure to comply, ordered to pay \$20 on date of court and balance within three weeks.
