The rule of thumb in planting shrubs is to set them the same depth that they grew in the nursery. Even then, the plant may settle unless the soil is firm under it.

This winter while deeply planted shrubs are dormant, you may want to raise them to the proper position. Of course, if they have been doing all right, leave them alone.

This is also the season to do something about those plants around the home that have grown too big. There are an awful lot of those around Tar Heel homes, if you will notice.

About the only solution is to remove the plants and start over. This harsh measure would apply mostly to conifers, such as arborvitae and Pfitzer juniper.

Top or tip pruning may not be satisfactory on many plants, because they are bare around the bottom. Old burford holly, pittosporum, cleyers, Japanese holly and similar evergreens can be cut back to 12 to 18 inches from the ground in the dormant season and allowed to bush out again.
