He is a 1984 graduate of Northwest High School.

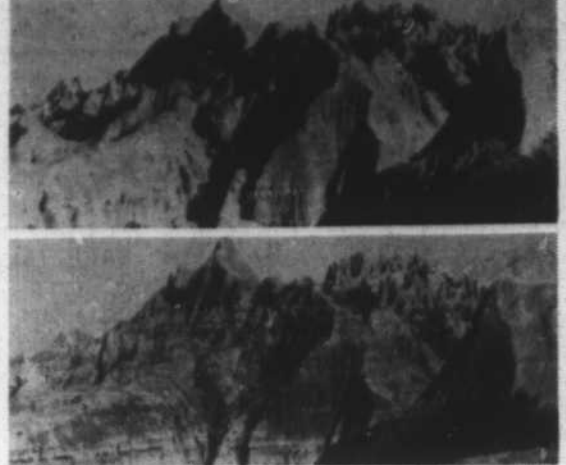
Ends Course

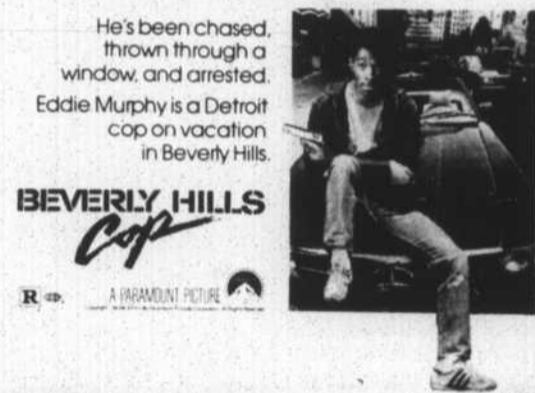

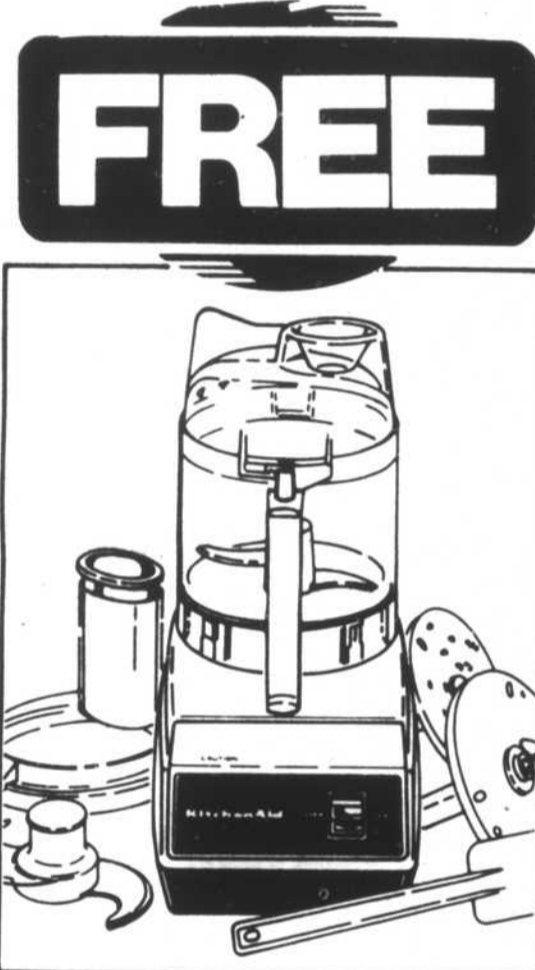
