# Cold Damage Can Cause Loss Of Camellia Buds

Any signs of unusually heavy loss of camellia buds are, more than likely, evidence of cold damage, suggest North Carolina State University agricultural extension specialists.

When buds fall from the plant just before opening, cold damage is probably the reason. Sudden bursts of cold weather often cause the plant damage.

A bud can be killed in November or December and hold to the plant until March before swelling and trying to open into a full bloom before dropping off.

To determine if a bud has been damaged by cold, cut through it so as to split the stem to which it is attached. If the cone-shaped base the petals are on is brown or black, the bud

will fail to open properly. If the base is white or cream colored, the bud was not damaged and would have opened into a full flower.

The NCSU specialists suggest that, where camellias seem to drop their flower buds very often — three out of four years or so — you might consider planting pines to shade them or moving them to a semi-shady location. Consider moving them to a spot where the morning sun won't hit them and where they will be protected from cold winds.

You may also select a variety that has resistance to cold. A combination of this selection and the above described location should keep your plant out of trouble.
