

Judge Allen Presides Over Session Of Warren Court

Judge C. W. Allen, Jr. of Oxford presided over the Feb. 27 session of Warren County District Court, disposing of the following cases:

Bobby Alexander, trespassing without a license, ordered to jail for a period of 90 days; defendant, through counsel, gave notice of appeal to the next criminal session of Warren County Superior Court, continuing bond to remain in effect.

Rhonda C. Ashby, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed.

Diane F. Barrett, speeding 68 in 55 mph zone, called and failed, dismissed with leave by the prosecutor.

Edward Bryant, four counts of assault on a law officer, ordered to prison for 18 months, sentence to begin at the expiration of any and all sentences now obligated to serve.

Orlander Bullock, breaking and/or entering and larceny, entered a plea of guilty of misdemeanor larceny, ordered to prison as a Committed Youthful Offender for a period not to exceed 12 months, sentence suspended and defendant placed on supervised probation for two years upon usual conditions and following special conditions that the defendant pay a \$100 fine and court costs, pay restitution to Mr. Boyd in the amount of \$335, perform 72 hours of community service within four months and pay the \$50 fee, reimburse the state \$125 for attorney fees, pay the \$10 monthly probation supervision fee, and obey other such rules as the probation officer might set forth.

Ollie L. Carter, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed arrest order outstanding.

Harry Christian, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed.

Andrew Collins, intoxicated and disruptive, ordered to jail for 10 days, sentence suspended for 12 months upon condition that the defendant pay a \$20 fine and court costs and not be found guilty of any crime involving alcohol during the period of suspension.

Merlton Cooper, tres-

passing without a license and assault on a female, dismissed by the prosecutor.

Gary Daniel, two counts of assault on a law officer and one count of disorderly conduct, ordered to prison for 12 months, sentence suspended and defendant placed on special supervised probation for two years upon condition that he serve 40 days in jail, pay the costs of court, perform 72 hours of community service within four months and pay the \$50 fee, pay \$25 restitution for Officer Harrison's medical bills, pay the probation supervision fee, and for a period of two years not be found guilty of any crime involving assault; defendant gave notice of appeal to the next criminal session of Superior Court, continuing bond to remain in effect.

Stanford Daniels, damage to real property, assault on a law officer, and disorderly conduct, ordered to prison for two years, sentence suspended and defendant placed on special supervised probation for two years upon condition that he serve 90 days in jail, pay the costs of court, perform 72 hours community service and pay the \$50 fee, pay the probation supervision fee, cause the damaged bicycle to be repaired within four months; defendant gave notice of appeal to the next criminal session of Superior Court, continuing bond to remain in effect.

Ralie Daniels, resisting/obstructing a public officer, assault on a law officer, communicating threats, and disorderly conduct; found guilty of all charges with the exception of assault on a law officer, ordered to prison for four months, sentence suspended for two years upon condition that the defendant not be found guilty of any crime involving assault for a period of two years, perform 72 hours of community service within 90 days and pay the \$50 fee, and pay the costs of court within 30 days.

Kerry M. Dunston, no driver's license, called and failed, arrest order outstanding.

Pat Ellington, check fraud, no bank account, ordered to jail for 30 days, sentence suspended for 12 months upon condition that the defendant pay \$71.45 restitution and costs of court, and for a period of 12 months not be found

guilty of giving a worthless check.

Tony L. Faucette, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed, arrest order issued, bond set at \$100.

Charles Foster, inspection violation, prayer for judgment continued upon payment of court costs.

Clarence Green, driving while impaired and carrying a concealed weapon, motion to continue denied, called and failed, order of forfeiture and order for arrest issued, bond set at \$1,000.

Gene Groom, violation of court order, called and failed, order of forfeiture and order for arrest issued, bond set at \$400.

Solomon Hargrove, driving while impaired, ordered to jail for a period of six months, sentence suspended and defendant placed on unsupervised probation for 12 months upon condition that he pay a \$200 fine and court costs, and complete the Alcohol and Drug Education Traffic School and pay the fee; defendant not to be required to do community service due to his health and not be entitled to a limited driving privilege.

Herome Hooten, larceny and injury to personal property, motion to continue denied, ordered to prison for 14 months; defendant gave notice of appeal to the next criminal session of Superior Court, bond set at \$1,000.

Douglas P. Jones, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed order for arrest outstanding.

Phillip J. Jones, driving while impaired, driving after drinking by a provisional licensee and no driver's license, called and failed, arrest order issued, bond set at \$200.

George E. Mangum, two counts of assault on a female, one count of assault with a deadly weapon, two counts of endangering reckless driving, and two counts of assault and battery, court ordered that the defendant be sent to Dorothea Dix Hospital until such time as his mental status can be evaluated for competency to proceed, bond dissolved on request of the surety and defendant placed in the custody of the sheriff, case to be docketed for trial when the defendant has been evaluated.

Ruth McMillan, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed.

Robert Peace, no driver's license, called and failed, arrest order returned unserved.

Allen Pope, no driver's license, dismissed by the prosecutor; driving while impaired, ordered to jail for 40 days, sentence suspended and defendant placed on unsupervised probation for 12 months upon condition that he pay a \$75 fine and court costs, perform 24 hours of community service within 30 days and pay the fee and complete the Alcohol and Drug Education Traffic School and pay the fee.

Sam Powell, Jr., assault on a female, dismissed by the prosecutor.

Julie M. Rettig, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed.

Bessie Richardson, three counts of worthless check, called and failed, order of for-

feiture and order for arrest issued, bond set at \$400.

Eddie Lee Smith, operating a motor vehicle without financial responsibility, no driver's license, and no registration for vehicle, ordered to jail for 90 days, sentence suspended for 12 months upon condition that the defendant pay a \$30 fine and court costs.

Thomas Solomon, driving while impaired,

ordered to jail for six months, sentence suspended for 12 months upon condition that the defendant pay a \$200 fine and court costs, complete 72 hours of community service and pay the fee, complete the Alcohol and Drug Education Traffic School and pay the fee and obtain an Abuse Assessment and pay the fee.

Theodore Vaughan, driving while impaired,

ordered to jail for 40 days, sentence suspended and defendant placed on unsupervised probation for 12 months upon condition that he pay a \$100 fine and court costs, perform 24 hours of community service within 30 days and pay the fee, and complete the Alcohol and Drug Education Traffic School and pay the fee.

Michael Vick, assault on a female and communicating threats,

motion to dismiss denied, ordered to prison for 18 months; defendant gave notice of appeal to the next criminal session of Superior Court, continuing bond to remain in effect.

Gregory Watkins, breaking and/or entering and larceny, entered a plea of guilty of misdemeanor larceny, ordered to prison as a Committed Youthful Offender for a period not to exceed 12 months, sentence suspended and defendant placed on supervised probation for two years upon usual conditions and following special conditions that he pay a \$100 fine and court costs, pay restitution to Mr. Boyd in the amount of \$335, perform 72 hours of community

service within four months and pay the \$50 fee, reimburse the state \$125 for attorney fees, pay the \$10 monthly probation supervision fee, and obey other such rules as the probation officer might set forth.

Michael Williams, speeding more than 15 mph over the speed limit, entered a plea of guilty of speeding 64 in 55 mph zone, ordered to pay a \$40 fine and court costs.

Catherine Solomon, speeding 70 in 55 mph zone, called and failed, arrest order issued, bond set at \$100.

Joyce P. Schuster, motion to strike order of forfeiture, Judgment absolute on \$175.

John G. Mulchi, motion for modification of support order, prior order modified to extend that the defendant shall pay one-half of all medical bills as submitted to him by the prosecuting witness for

the two minor children in the matter within two weeks of her submitting a bill, monthly support payments to be increased to \$185.

Samuel Moore, oral motion by surety to set aside forfeiture, judgment of remission of bond posted.
