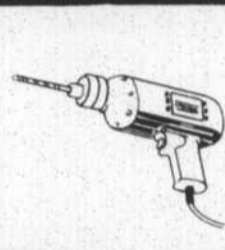
Mrs. C. E. Thompson expressed her gratitude for the cooperation and encouragement from everyone throughout the past two years of her term as president.
