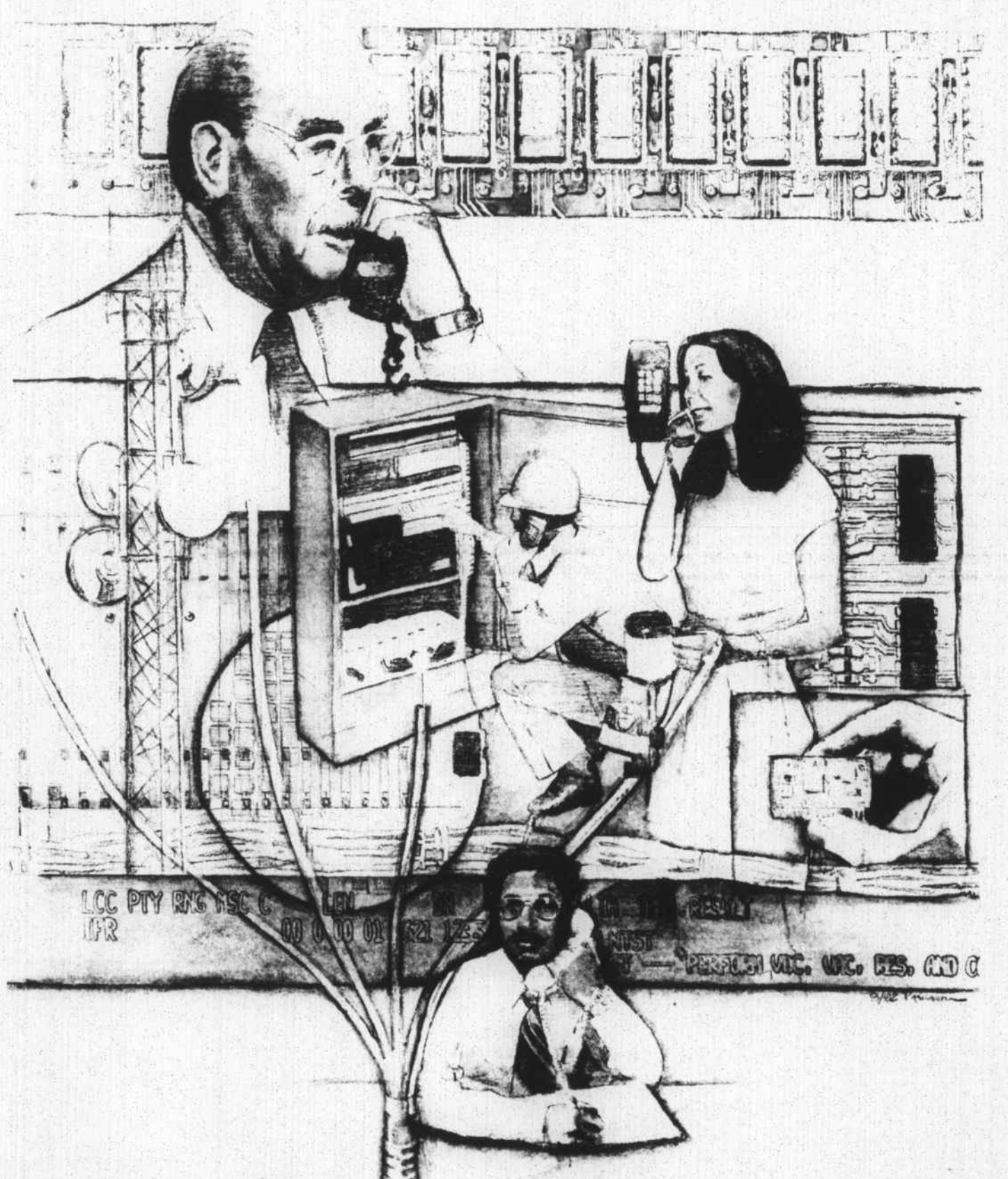
THERE ARE AROUND 43 SPECIES OF GULLS.

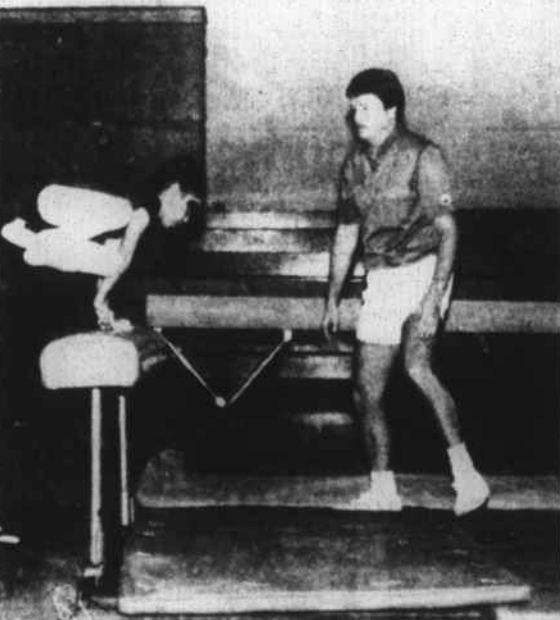
# Making Better Connections In Warren County
