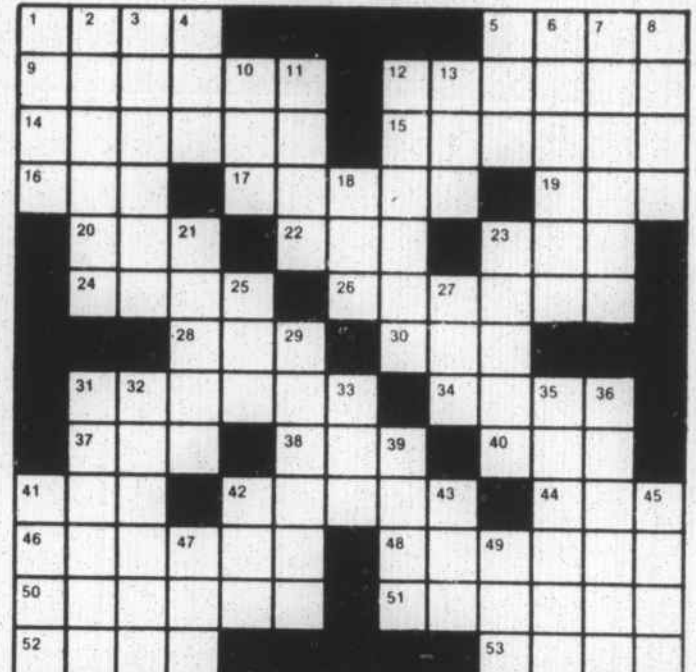

Mrs. Joyce Rogers of Durham and Ms. Angela Greene of Roanoke Rapids presided over the gift table.

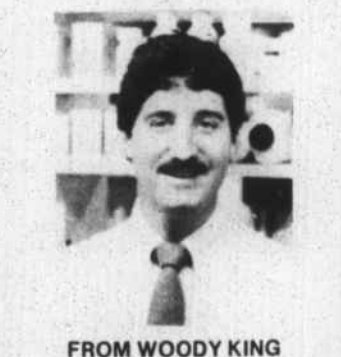
Rehearsal Dinner
