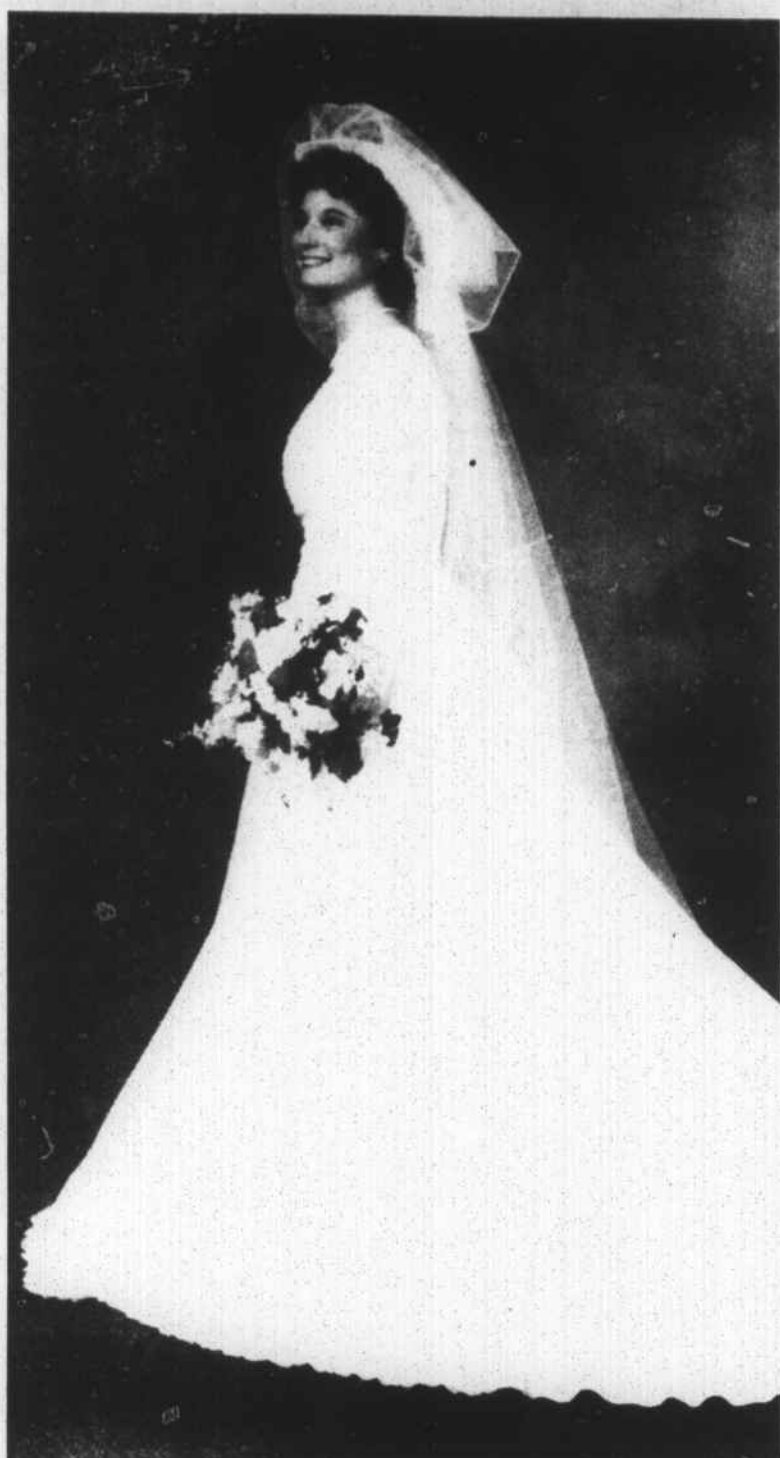
Mrs. R. G. Norwood spent the past week in Durham with her nephew, Robert L. Goodbar, and his wife, Betty.
