Doors open at 7 p.m. Tickets for the 8 p.m. match will be available at the door for \$6. Children will be admitted for \$4.

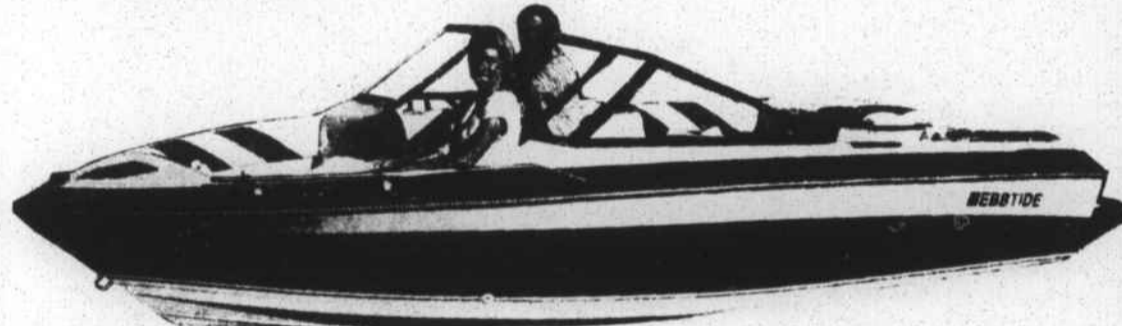
