teachers based on attendance figures compiled on the tenth day

Enrollment figures taken on the tenth day determine the state allocation of teaching positions and since the figures from this year are little changed from last year, no teacher gain or loss is anticipated, School Supt. Mike Williams said Tuesday

Figures compiled on last Friday showed the following number of students in these public schools in the county

Warren County High School-906, Vaughan Elementary School-246, Mariam Boyd-320, Northside-293, North Warren-261, Hawkins-276, John Graham-246, Norlina-224, South Warren-219 and special students-15. All told, there were 2,996 students in classes on Friday, the tenth day of the 1988-89 school year.
