

Membership Campaign Begun By Associates

The N. C. Museum of History Associates began their 1988 Membership Campaign recently with a luncheon and orientation session for 90 volunteers from mideastern North Carolina at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Peterson in Tarboro.

Three members from the state history museum's Warren County committee were present at the luncheon. They were Mrs. Leigh (Lou) Traylor, Mrs. Clayton

(Mary Lib) Taylor and Mrs. Jesse (Marie) Martin.

The Museum Associates is a 13,000 member statewide support group for the N. C. Museum of History and 24 state historic sites. The group provides funds for museum exhibits, artifact purchases and educational programs in every county of the state.

Campaign volunteers were among the first to view an extremely rare set of 12 silver forks made by Charlotte silversmith Thomas Trotter (1827-1865). According to Warren County acting Chairman Mrs. Jan Perkinson, "The forks were purchased for \$4,200 by the Museum Associates with membership funds." The forks are made in the fiddle style with rounded lobes and tipped handles.

Volunteers also heard about several educational resources which the Museum Associates are providing for all eighth grade social studies classrooms in N. C. These include several audiovisual programs, such as "The Roanoke Voyages/America's 400th Anniversary," "The Way We Were in North Carolina" and "The North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame." Each of these educational resources is provided free of charge to teachers and students. The programs are also available to other grade levels and private schools upon request.

"The Museum Associates are pleased to return membership funds directly to every county of the state through these programs," Mrs. Perkinson stated, "and it helps me in my job of recruiting members in Warren County when people can see a direct benefit here at home."

Deed Transfers

In recording deed transfers the law does not require that the amount paid for property be stated in the deed. However, the State of North Carolina requires a tax stamp on each deed at the rate of 50 cents for every \$500 valuation or fraction thereof. This revenue goes into the General Fund of the counties.
