Winston and the Gas Question.

"What will be the next move in the gas plant matter?" is a question that some of our citizens are asking. Under a resolution passed by the Aldermen some weeks ago the board of aldermen practically said that it would either buy the present plant or put another in operation by the city. This resolution, however, was adopted before the city attorneys had given an opinion in which they stated that it would be necessary for the voters to decide in an election whether they were in favor of voting bonds for the proposed gas plant. In speaking of the matter today a city official stated that if the present owners of the plant will make the necessary improvements and reduce the price of gas he saw no need for the city to go any further in the matter. The aldermen will probably discuss the matter at their regular monthly meeting tonight.
