GERMANY MAY CHANGE FORM OF GOVERNMENT

BERLIN, May 14.—DieWelt states that the Kaiser, in a private conversation, has expressed the opinion that since Russia has become a constitutional monarchy it will be impossible for Germany to maintain its present constitutional system of government. Germany, by upholding undiluted reaction, would gain a bad name as a stronghold of political tyranny. The emperor has expressed hope that the German government will now find it profitable to dispense with the support of reactionary conservatives and radicals who now form a majority in Reichstag and to construct new progressive majority, enabling the government to conduct affairs in accordance with most progressive principles.
