Spanish Paper Reproduces Photo graph Taken at Time of Attempt to Kill Alfonso. rom Madrid Dispatch.

A remarkable photograph taken at the moment of the attempt to kill Alfonso and his bride, appears in the carrent number of the illustrated journal, A. B. C. It gives a far more rivid picture of the occurrence that t is possible to deduce from confuse: and conflicting narratives.

In the middle of the road is the king's carriage with the coachman still on the box. To the right is a dense fog of dust, from the middle of which emerge the figures of three mounted soldlers, one apparently headless, and another with his arm
