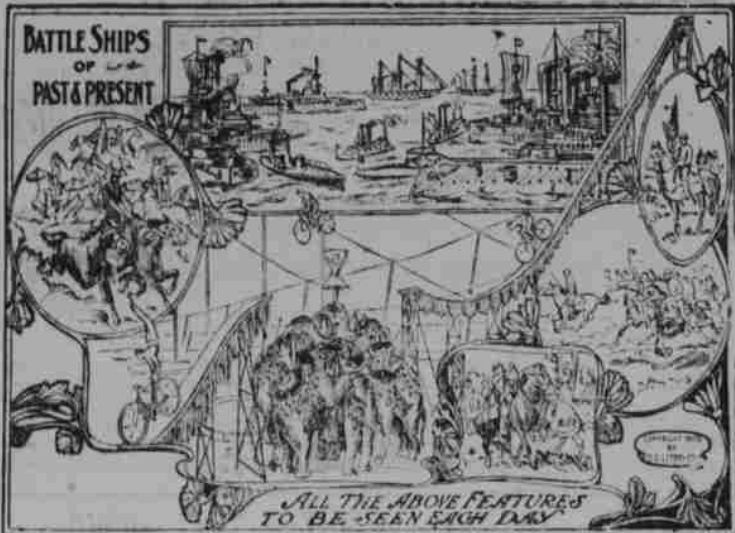

SIX PREACHERS OFF TO BIG METROPOLIS

Rev. J. J. Beach, of Yadkin, and by W. M. Robbins, of Davie, passed through the city Thursday en route to Greensboro for a free trip to New York. A special from Lexington to Charlotte Observer says:

Thursday six ministers of the gospel, successful contestants in a voting contest of the Lexington Dispatch, left for New York city, where they will spend ten days sight-seeing at the expense of The Dispatch. These ministers are Revs. Henry Sheets and J. D. Newton of Davidson county; J. J. Beach, of Yadkin; K. C. Harner, of Montgomery; C. M. Campbell, Sr., of Randolph; and W. M. Robbins, of Davie. They were accompanied by Mr. J. B. Varner, editor of the Dispatch, and will go to Norfolk from Greensboro. At Norfolk they spend a day looking over the city and will go by steamer from that place to New York. The itinerary will be extended up the Hudson River to West Point and the program includes the Bryan reception, at which the party has seats. Coney Island will be "old" as never before to any New York visitors. In addition to the contestants, several other gentlemen will make the trip. The ministers are supposed to be the most popular in the five counties named and were selected by the people of the counties, and as the New York Sun says, while they may not be as beautiful as the Louisville Courier-Journal's party of ladies, these clergymen are good. Their coming has already been heralded in the metropolis and of course the town is on tip-toe with expectation.
