The derailed cars were in the middle of the train, and the engine with four cars was cut loose from the train and proceeded on to Dry Fork. Four other rear cars were left standing on the track. The wrecked cars were badly smashed up and piled in one congested beap. Some of the cars were completely turned over, while others were standing on their sides. The track was torn up for a distance of over a hundred yards. The crew escaped in-jury except Conductor Davidson, who was in charge. Mr. Davidson was injurabout the back, but not seriously hurt. The fact that more were not injured and there were no fatalities was probably due to the wrecked ears being in the middle of the train.
