Wants Southern to Extend Its Road from Advance to Yadkinville.

To the Editor: I have been requested by some of the leading business men of Davis county to address the public and particularly the progressive and enterprising business men of Winston-Salem, and the Southern Railroad officials, in behalf of our ambitious desire for them to investigate the availability and practicability of building a railway from Advance via Farmington or Yadkinville. This route will bring us in closer touch without the hindrance of Winston-Salem's death-rattle electric and trolley, and would avoid the necessity of spanning the Yadkin with another bridge, and with the exception of one or two hills this side of Advance, will require a very gradey ridge road of about twenty-five miles, connecting the two extreme points mentioned.

I believe it could be operated upon a paying basis from the beginning. To prove our faith in the above proposition, the Farmington township, I think, will vote \$25,000 worth of bonds to mature in twenty years.
