WINSTON ALDERMEN HOLD SPECIAL SESSION

The Winston aldermen, in special session last night, decided to condemn some property in the northwestern part of the city for the purpose of building a street leading to the new woolen mill to be erected by the Chatham Manufacturing Company. The question of buying the gravel pit just west of the city was discussed, but no definite action was taken. The owners of the pit want \$3,500 for it.

FOUR PARDONS GRANTED; SEVEN ARE REFUSED

(Special to The Sentinel.)

RALEIGH, Nov. 15.—Governor Glenn yesterday granted four pardons and refused seven other applications for pardons. He also granted one commutation, this being to John Caddy, of Rowan county, sentenced at the April term, 1906, to two years for forcible trespass. His commutation was to one year, his release to be next April.

The pardons and reasons briefly stated were as follows:

Frank Towers, Burke county, sentenced at the August term, 1905, for bigamy. Prisoner is an old and ignorant man and seems to have thought that his first wife was dead. The Solicitor and county commissioners advised for the commutation.

John Evans, Rockingham county, sentenced in November, 1905, to 12 months for assault and battery on his wife. It appears that the man was more shamed against than shamed.

Walter Nelson, Buncombe county, sentenced in November, 1906, to 18 months in jail for aiding a prisoner to break jail. Pardon asked by judge and county commissioners.

W. W. Phifer, Mecklenburg county, sentenced in August, 1905, for stealing a bicycle. Recommended by judge and solicitor. Prisoner is 17 years old.

Pardons Refused.

L. A. Spruce, Madison county, sentenced in February, 1905, for forcible trespass. He was really guilty of force and obtaining money under false pretense.

James Armstrong, serving 18 months in Mecklenburg county, for larceny. Judge and commissioners do not recommend pardon.

Thomas Hathaway, Chowan county, sentenced at the Fall term, 1900, to fifteen years in the penitentiary for perjury. Neither judge nor solicitor recommends pardon.

Nelson Ramgarber, Wilkes county, sentenced in March, 1906, for manslaughter. In the Governor's opinion the sentence of four years was very mild.

Stokes McCrary, Buncombe county, sentenced in 1905 to two years for larceny. Pending his application for pardon he made his escape but was recaptured.

Bob Sutherman, Forsyth county, sentenced in 1905 to two years for larceny. Neither judge nor solicitor recommends pardon. Governor pronounced that the prisoner, owing to his health, be kept in the jail and not sent out to work on the road.

OPINIONS BY THE SUPREME COURT

RALEIGH, Nov. 15.—Opinions were delivered by the Supreme Court this day evening in thirteen cases as follows:

Wells vs. Seaboard Air Line Railroad Co., from Anson, affirmed.

Hicks vs. Manufacturers Co., from Guilford, affirmed.

Railway Co. vs. Railroad Co., from Guilford, decided in favor of the defendant in both cases.

Isley vs. Bridge Co., Alamance, new trial.

Woody vs. Fountain, Person, no error.

Holgin vs. Railroad Co., Guilford, affirmed.

Crifton vs. Railway, Rowan, affirmed.

Thaxton vs. Insurance Co., Rowan, affirmed.

Typewriter Co. vs. Hardware Co., Rowan, affirmed.

Jones vs. Commissioners of Stokes county, no error in both appeals.

Maryon vs. Brewer, Montgomery, reversed.

Duffy vs. Insurance Co., Craven, permanent, affirmed.

Millig Co. vs. Cole, from Cabarrus, dismissed.

Probably the most notable case in the line is **Railroad Co. vs. Hardware Co.**, from Guilford, this being a suit in which the Pittsburg, Johnston, Eno, and Western Railroad Co. brought suit against the Wakefield Hardware Co. of Greensboro, for damages for the reason that the Wakefield Hardware Co. attached sea coal cars to the railroad company for a debt of \$145 owed by the Coal and Coal Co. of Guilf. The debt was for hardware furnished to repair these cars which were loaned to the Gulf company. The ruling of the lower court in not allowing the damage is under the operation of the opinion of the Supreme Court sustained.

Another case of more than usual interest is **Price vs. Commissioners of Stokes county**, which has the effect of sustaining the obligation of the county commissioners to observe the provisions of an act of the last legislature to set apart the taxes paid in certain townships of the county on the property of the old Cape Fear and Vaddin Valley railroad for public road improvement and \$10,000 is refunded that the township originally subscribed for the securing of this road through the township. The court holds that there is no constitutional requirement that taxes shall be levied on all parts of the county.
