## FOUR PAROONS GRANTED; SEVEN ARE REFUSED OPINIONS BY THE SUPREME COURT

(Special to The Sentinel)

RALEIGH, Nov. 15.—Governor Allen yesterday granted four paroons and refused seven other applications for paroons. He also granted one commutation this being to John Caddie, of Bertie county, sentenced at the April term, 1905, to two years for forcible trespass. His commutation was for one year, his release to be next April.

The pardons and reasons briefly stated were as follows:

Frank Towery, Burke county, sentenced at the August term, 1895, for bigamy. Prisoner is an old and ignorant man and seems to have thought that his first wife was dead. The Superior and county commissioners asked for the commutation.

John Evans, Rockingham county, sentenced in November, 1905, on 12 months for assault and battery on his wife. It appears that the man was more shamed against than stung.

Walter Nelson, Bentonia county, sentenced in November, 1905, in 18 months in jail for aiding a prisoner to break jail. Pardon asked by judge and county commissioners.

W. H. Pfifer, Mecklenburg county, sentenced in August, 1905, for stealing a bicycle. Recommended by Judge and solicitor. Prisoner is 12 years old.

### PARDONS REFUSED.

L. A. Sprague, Madison county sentenced in February, 1905, for forcible trespass. He was really guilty of forgery and obtaining money under false pretenses.

James Armstrong, serving 18 months in Iredell county, for larceny. Judge and commissioners do not recommend pardon.

Thomas Hathaway, Caldwell county, sentenced at the Fall term, 1905, to fifteen years in the penitentiary for perjury. Neither judge nor solicitor recommends pardon.

Nelson Bangs, Wilkes county, sentenced in March, 1905, for manslaughter. In the Governor's opinion the sentence of four years was very mild.

Stokes McCrary, Buncombe county, sentenced in 1905 to two years for larceny. Pending his application for pardon he made his escape but was recaptured.

John Shifnerman, Forsyth county, sentenced in 1905 to two years for larceny. Neither judge nor solicitor recommends pardon. Governor recommends that the prisoner, owing to his health, be kept in the jail and not sent out to work on the roads.

## OPINIONS BY THE SUPREME COURT

RALEIGH, Nov. 15.—Opinions were delivered to the Supreme Court this evening in thirteen cases as follows:

Elks vs. Standard Air Line Railroad Co., from Ashe, no error.

Hicks vs. Manufacturing Co., from Guilford, no error.

Railway Co. vs. Railways Co., from Guilford, decided in favor of the defendant in both cases.

Taylor vs. Bridge Co., Alamance, now trial.

Wood vs. Fountain, Person, no error.

Hodgin vs. Railways Co., Guilford, affirmed.

Clinton vs. Railways, Rowan, affirmed.

Thaxton vs. Insurance Co., Rowan, affirmed.

Typewriter Co. vs. Hardware Co., Rowan, affirmed.

Jones vs. Commissioners of Stokes county, no error in both appeals.

Barron vs. Bowser, Mecklenburg, reversed.

Duffy vs. Insurance Co., Craven, affirmed.

Milling Co. vs. Cole, same, from Carrboro, dismissed.

Probably the most notable case in the line is Railroad Co. vs. Hardware Co., from Guilford, this being a suit in which the Pittsboro, Jacksonville, Ennisburg and Western Railroad Co. brought suit against the Wakefield Hardware Co. of Greensboro, for damages for the reason that the Wakefield Hardware Co. attached ten coal cars of the railroad company for a debt of \$145, owed by the Coke and Coal Co. of Gulf. The debt was the hardware furnished to repair these cars which were loaned to the Gulf company. The filing of the lower court in not allowing the damage is under the operation of the opinion of the Supreme Court sustained.

Another case of more than usual interest is Price vs. Commissioners of Stokes county, which has the effect of sustaining the obligation of the county commissioners to observe the provisions of acts of the last legislature to set apart the taxes paid in certain townships of the county on the property of the old Cape Fear and Yadkin Valley railroad for public road improvement until \$10,000 is returned.

It is held that the township originally subscribed for the securing of this road through the township. The court holds that there is no constitutional requirement that taxes shall be the same in all parts of the county.
