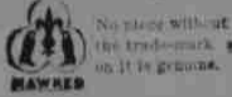

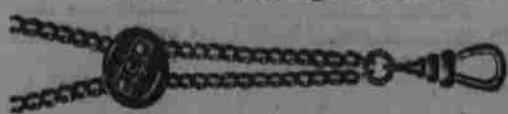

### Fast Mail To Be Discontinued.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—In accordance with a request of the Southern Railway Company, Postmaster-General Corteljon announced today that on January 5 the contract with it to supply fast mail service between Washington and Atlanta would be terminated. The inability of the Southern to make the schedule required by the department is the explanation given by the company for its desire to be relieved from the terms of the contract. The subsidy cost the government about \$150,000 a year.
