TELEPHONE SITUATION IN CITY OF RALEIGH

RALEIGH, Dec. 22.—A franchise is granted by the Raleigh Board of Aldermen for the Capital City Telephone Company, which will take over the local exchanges of the Southern Bell Telephone and Interstate Companies. The Bell company will have a controlling interest in the new company. This will leave Raleigh with two instead of three separate telephone systems, the Raleigh remaining in the field as an independent company. For some time this city has labored under the distinction of being the only town in the United States having three separate systems. The new company will install an entirely new plant in a building of its own, to cost \$20,000. The franchise fixes the rates at \$2.50 per month for business and \$1.50 for residence phones until the exchange has more than 1,000 subscribers; then graduated rate charges are provided for.

Dynamite Explosion at Davidson Mine.
The Lexington Dispatch says that Monday evening about 5 o'clock there was an accidental explosion of dynamite in the famous mine, near Clio, in which Thomas Wright was badly hurt, and Walter Hughes was slightly injured. Millberry Hill, John Gallimore and Leonard Wilson were severely shaken up. Everything had been made ready for a blast and Wright had a stick of dynamite and a lighted candle in the same hand. The two got together, which brought on the explosion a little earlier than was expected.

Convict-Made Bridles at Shelby, Too.
This is from the Shelby Star: Mr. Cullen Mull, one of the leading citizens of No. 19 township, was here Friday, and received from the express office a package containing two fine leather bridles, made by Mr. Seymour Warester, who is serving a term in the Colorado penitentiary. The bridles were made by Warester himself, and they are extraordinarily fine ones and demonstrate the remarkable workmanship of the man. He sent them to be sold.

Bound Over For Larceny.

Hugh Nading and Hope Archie, the latter colored, were before Mayor Eaton this morning on the charge of larceny. Nading was accused of stealing walnuts from a restaurant, while Archie was tried for stealing dried tongues from the larder at Hotel Zinzendorf. Both were bound over to Superior Court and in default of bail were sent to jail.
