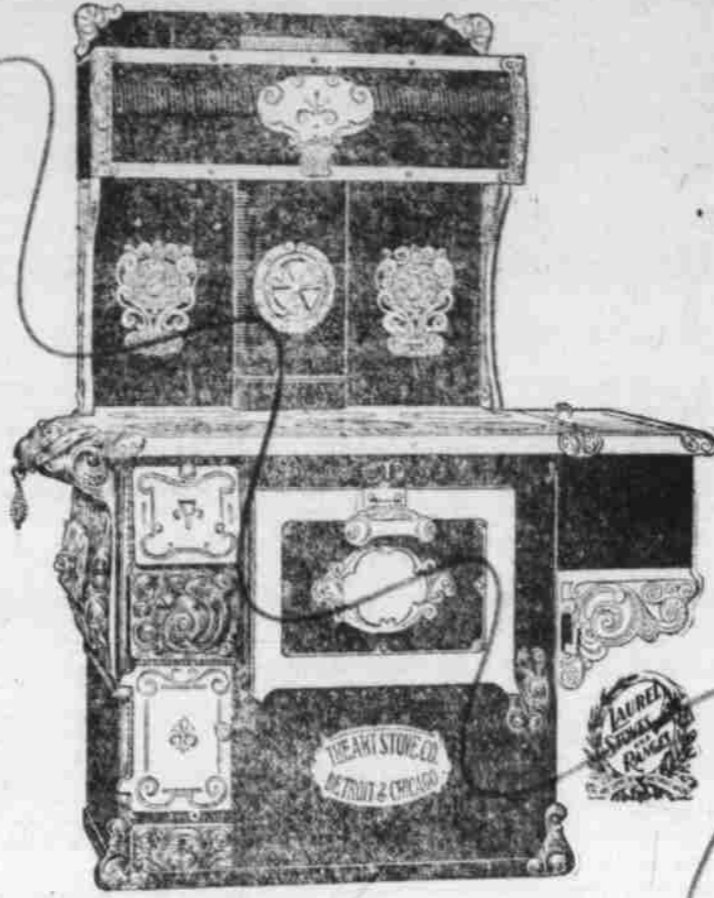

Thousands See the Big Circus Parade In Spite of Inclement Weather

The thousands of people who saw Ringling Brothers' big parade this afternoon say it was the greatest circus pageant that ever passed through the streets of Winston-Salem. From the great twenty-four horse chariot in the lead to the tail end, it was one chain of novel surprises.

Some of the remarkable features were teams of camels, zebras, llamas and elephants, hitched to ornate tabernacle floats and driven like horses. It has been supposed that the zebras could not be broken to harness. The Ringlings have proved otherwise. There were any number of ten and twelve-horse teams and many magnifi-

cent animals driven tandem. In all nearly 700 horses were exhibited. The majority were white Norman Percherons, beautifully groomed and in the pink of health. Over 1,200 men, women and children, from Australian bushwhackers to the royalty of Asia and Europe, took part. Music was provided by six brass bands, a cathedral organ, a catloope, barbarian orchestra, fife and drum corps, church chimes, trumpeters and Oriental string and reed musicians.

The Ringling Brothers are generous in the free display of their wild animals. Many of the cages were thrown open, and in them were seen various rare specimens of jungle life. The floats, the chariots and other display vehicles were elaborate in design and workmanship. A section of tiny floats, drawn by diminutive ponies and grouped with the characters of child-romance, were particularly attractive.

Everything was sale and span in its freshness. The flags, banners, costumes, drappings and various other trappings are costly and the vehicles looked as though they had just come from the foreign shops. In short, the spectacle was one of such brilliancy and of such length that those who saw it will not soon forget it.

The performance is now in progress under the big tents. Time allows but a brief mention of the many charms it contains, but it may be said right off the reel that never before has such an excellent company of performers been assembled under one management. The Schuman performing horses, the Arthur Saxon trio of strong men, the telephoning elephants, Mijaz, the Mexican wizard, the Cot-

trell-Powell equestrians, the Lorch family of acrobats, the famous Klarksonian aerialists and the Alex family of trapeze artists are but a few of those who give the show distinction. The Ringling Brothers have easily outdone their past records, which is saying much, for they have always maintained the brightest and the best circus in the country.
