JUDGES ACQUITTED.

The impeachment case a--Esq. Thompson Wood, of gainst Judges Furches and Douglass closed Thursday and the Judges were acquitted. The vote stood 27 for conviction and 23 for acquittal; but as it requires a two third vote declared acquitted. The vote to convict was made up of 27 best men in the State; the vote for acquittal was composed of ley Bros. 12 democratic jurors, as good men as the State affords, and 11 republican Senators, good men but hardly jurors, Pritch ard having tagged their votes before the trial. While it is an acquittal, it cannot be a vindication of the action of the Judges in overriding the constitution and laws of the State. The effect of the trial will result in much good. will remind the Legislature to be conservative and careful in passing laws. It also calls the Judges to a halt in their wild career of resolving themselves into political machine in viola tion of law and constitution. The people will see to it their Legislature acts right, and also that judges study Law in-
