## Parcels Post Law To Be Effective January 1

Washington Aug. 27.-The effect January $\mathbf{1}$, 1913 .
Under this legislation it is provided that hereafter fourth
class mail matter shalle mbrace all other matter including in cluding farm and factory products, not now embraced by law in either in the first, sec nd or third class, not exceed g eleven pounds in weigh nor greater in size than 72
inches in length and girth combined: nor in forn likely to injure the person of any
postal employe or damage the mail equipment or other mai natter, and not of a character perishable within a period reaonably required for transpor ation and delivery.
