GLEN WILLIAMS PROPERTY

Mrs. N. Glen Williams was in town one day the past week and filed her bond of \$50,000. as administratrix of the estate of her late husband N. Glen Williams who died a few weeks ago. The estate is valued at from \$175,000. about half of which is in personal property.

According to statements furnished us Mr. Williams carried life insurance to the amount of \$35,000. and has \$25,000. other personal property besides a large amount of whiskey which it is thought will net \$40,000. GREAT PARCEL POST EXTENSION

Washington, Dec. 6.—Postmaster General Burleson's proposal to increase the weight limits of parcel post packages in the first and second zones twenty to fifty pounds was approved today by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

It was agreed also to admit books to the parcel post and to reduce the rates in third, fourth fifth and sixth zones.
