Vote for the railroad.

The largest political demonstration gotten up in this country in twenty years was the one in New York on the 6th to greet Judge Thurman, the Democratic candidate for Vice-President. The great Madison Square Garden, the seating capacity of which is 10,000, had twenty thousand souls within its walls.

Warehouses, tobacco factories, cotton factories, water works, street railways, electric lights, etc., are the great finger boards to successful enterprise and it is only in railroad towns that such signs of progress are ever seen. It is no trouble to get a town on a boom and make it grow rapidly if it has people in it of the right spirit. At Asbury, N. C., a new town on the North Carolina and the Raleigh & Augusta railroads, they are selling lots 50 feet front by 200 feet deep at \$30 each, and payments made in installments. Lots are donated for schools and manufacturing purposes. The lots are going rapidly and it will soon be a city. At Mt. Holly the citizens are advertising for the different enterprises they need in that town and offer the lots free and pay freight on machinery. Let us get the railroad and then let the people who own the lots offer such inducements as the above and we will soon have a town of four or five thousand inhabitants.

We heard a controversy between two of our constituents the other day one for and the other against the rail road. The one against the road said he knew that the R. & D. road ran through the centre of Halifax county Va. and there were eight depots in that county and that the taxes there were more than three times what they are in this. If that man will acquaint himself a little with Virginia affairs he will see why the taxes are higher. The State and local debt of North Carolina is \$8,951,000, that of Virginia is \$2,000,000, nearly five times that of this State. North Carolina spends \$3,000,000 for public schools, Virginia spends \$800,000 about three times that of this State. These two items alone will show why the taxes in Virginia are higher than here besides there are other causes.

The Caswell Democratic County Convention met in the court house last Saturday. Col. Geo. Williamson was chairman. The following nominations were made: C. A. Howard for Representative, B. S. Graves for Sheriff, Geo. O. Wilson for Treasurer, and Erekli Slade for Register of Deeds.

Dockery as a Farmer.

CERTIFICATE OF HIS NEIGHBORS SHOWING HIM TO BE "A DEAD FAILURE." Correspondence News and Observer.

Mr. Blaine says the present generation must be taught the benefits of high protection.

An excellent idea. The Herald seconds the motion.

If a young man buys a suit of clothes for \$25, the amount of protection he pays for is \$9. The clothes without protection would cost \$14.

If he buys a \$1 hat he gets 40 cents worth of hat and 60 cents worth of protection.

If a young couple just beginning housekeeping buy a yard of Brussels carpet for \$1 they receive 45 cents in carpet and 54 cents in protection, or say for a whole room, \$12 worth of carpet and \$13 worth of protection. With fine wool eighteen dollars would be saved.

If a young woman pays nine dollars for a shawl she gets six dollars worth of shawl only; the other three she presents to the manufacturer to "protect" him.

If she buys a dress for eighteen dollars she gets twelve dollars worth of dress and six dollars worth of protection.

If, however, she wants a pair of shoes which formerly cost \$4.50 to \$5.50, she has only to pay \$2.50 or \$3.50, according to quality, because some of the protection has been taken off hides, from which the leather in the shoe is made.

If she pays 50 cents for an iron pot or pan she gets 30 cents in goods and 20 cents worth of protection.

If she wants a sewing machine and pays say 20 dollars for it, she gets 11 dollars worth of machine and 9 dollars worth of protection.

If she buys a clock for 3 dollars she receives 2 dollars worth of clock and 1 dollar worth of protection.

If she pays 16 dollars for a watch, 12 dollars represents the time-piece; the other 4 dollars go to "protect" somebody.




