For the American of pronounced patriotic tendencies, July 4 is the basis, and year 160 is already well under way. Really, it makes no difference when the year begins.

In the same sense used when we say there is "No East, no West", we might say there is no New Year, since time moves on without change of rhythm from one year to the next. And it may be well to remember also that a new beginning may be made at almost any time one desires it strongly enough. Susan Coolidge expressed it well thus:

Every day is a new beginning;  
The old year and the old refrain  
The old sorrows and other things  
Forecasted and probable pain,  
The day and begin again.

## New Year Statement

M. E. Coyle, president of Chevrolet Motor Co., states that indications point to a good year for business. During last year this firm expanded production capacities by one-fourth and feels that barring unpredictable accidents this rate should continue, which will produce effect upon many industries.

In 1935 Chevrolet produced more than one million cars, and for 3 years each annual output has been 200,000 more than the preceding year. In November and December more than 180,000 Chevrolets were sold.

## Alcohol to Blame

During the last month 434 drivers' licenses were revoked. It is a striking fact that of this number 421 were revoked for drunken driving, leaving only 13 for all other causes. Zebulon has only one name listed for the month, Wendell has two, Spring Hope 2, Bailey 2, Middlesex one. Of the 13 revoked for other causes than drunken driving four were for transporting whiskey

and one for allowing a drunk to drive the owner's car. The remaining eight were revoked for hit-and-run driving.

## Angier Policeman Held for Killing

C. F. Deans, chief of police at Angier, and Oris Pollard, policeman there, are held under heavy bond for the killing of G. F. Collins a farmer living near Angier. It is charged that Pollard beat Collins to death with his blackjack with the knowledge and assent of the chief. Collins was arrested for being drunk, and Pollard says that

he cursed the officer and that he struck him with his hand. Other evidence however does not look so good for the officer.

Former Governor Al Smith of New York will speak in Washington on January 28 under auspices of the Liberty League. It is expected that this will be the opening gun in the campaign against the re-election of President Roosevelt.

Mrs. Roosevelt invited Mr. Smith to spend the night at the White House but he declined. Formerly a close political and personal friend of the Roosevelts, he is now vigorously opposing the president.
