Caley Cain, escaped convict and North Carolina's bad man No. 1, is dead. He died at the home of a cousin near Clinton Tuesday morning from effects of wounds received in a battle with officers near Florence, S. C., the day before.

Cain, a Raleigh boy who got off on the wrong track some years ago, escaped last May from State prison and since then has been in constant flight from the law. He has been accused of several hold-ups and robberies.
