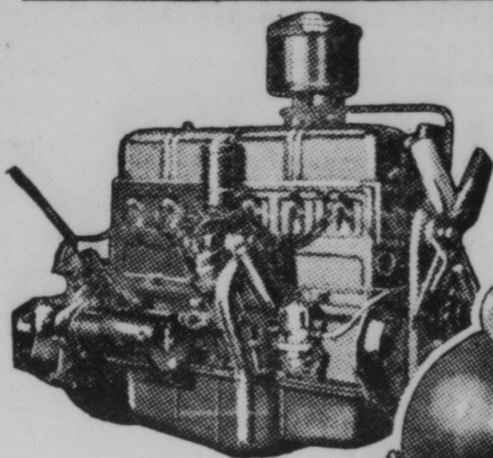

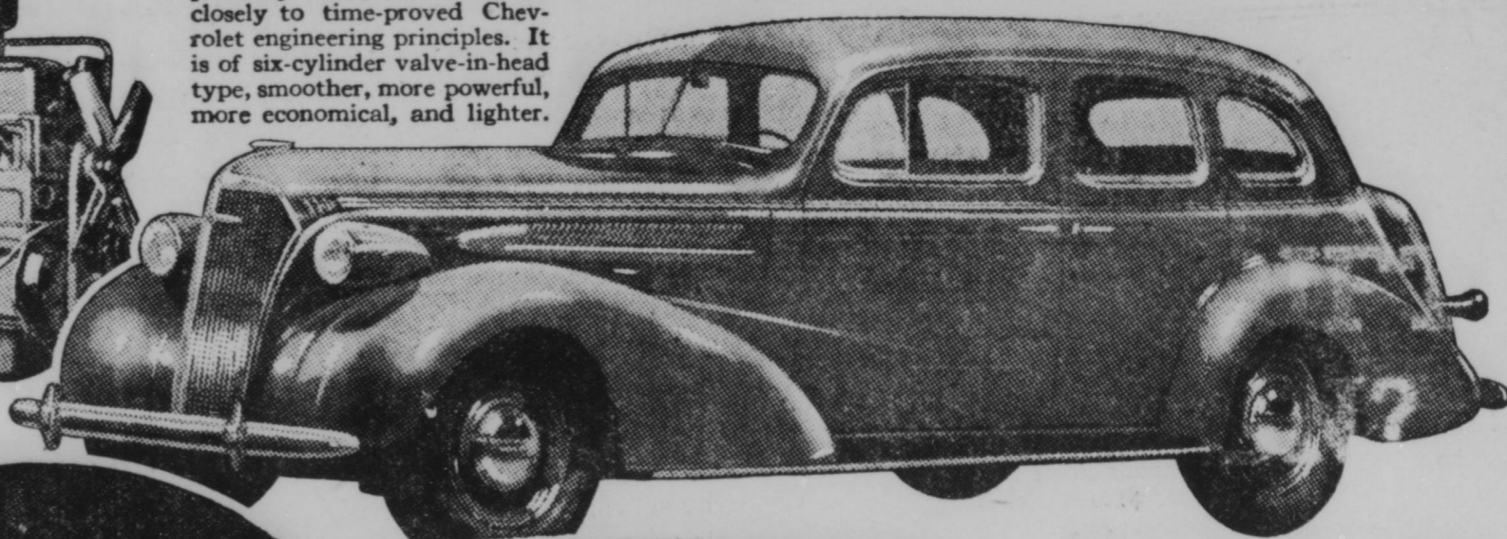
News Briefs

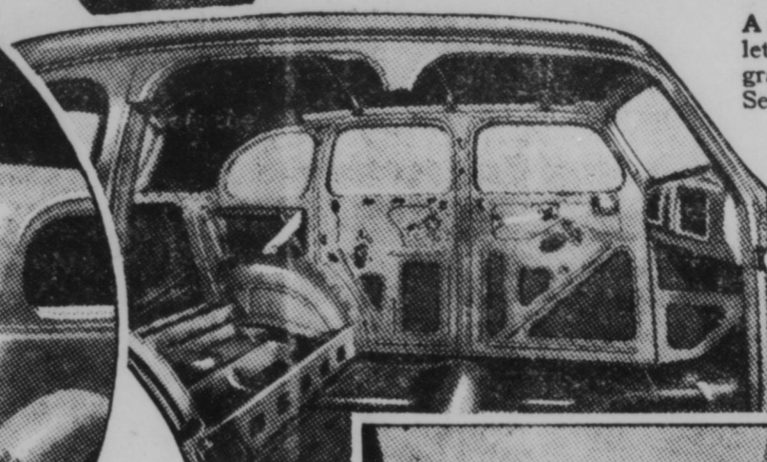

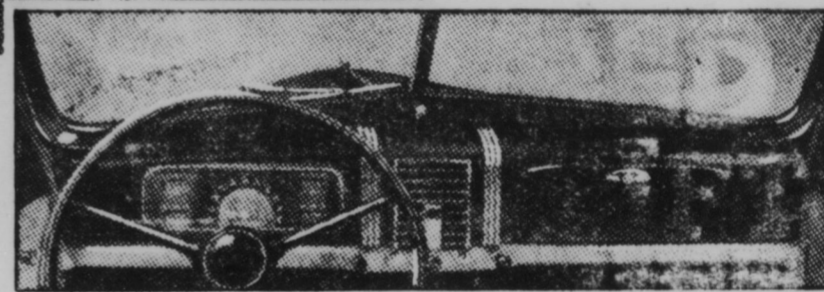
