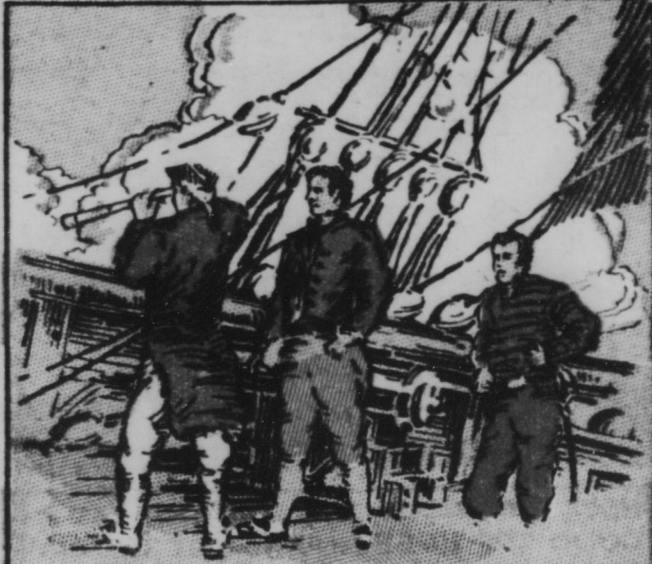
John Paul Jones

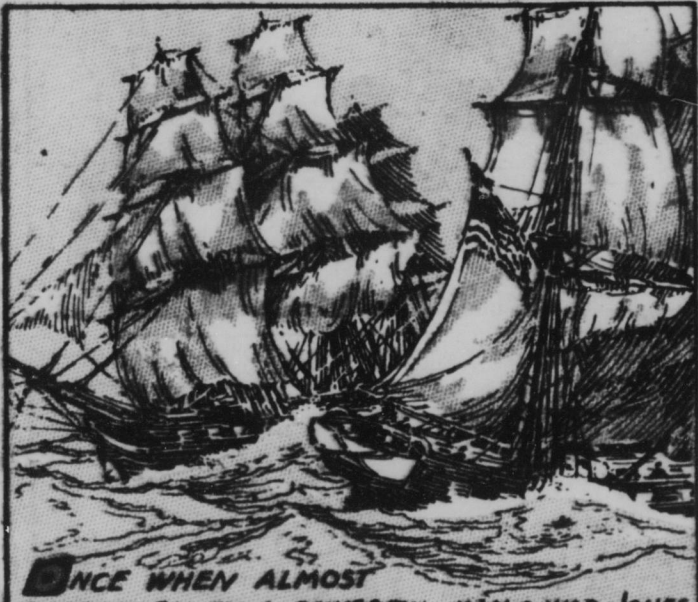

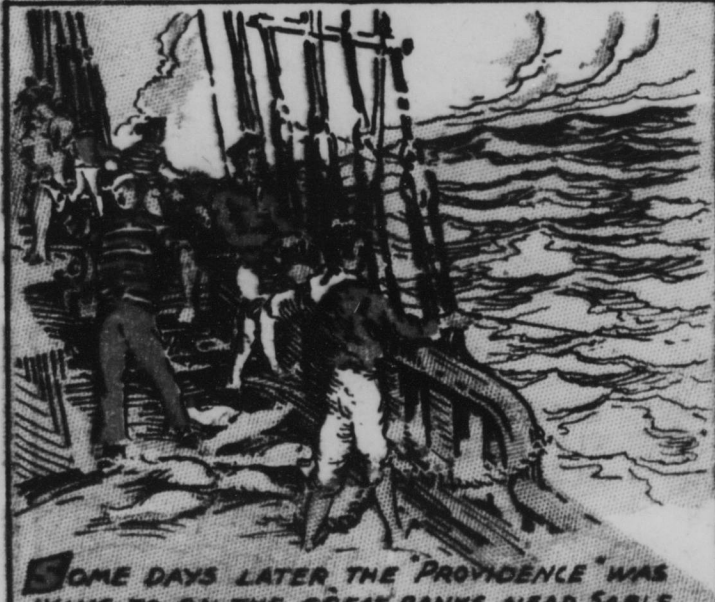

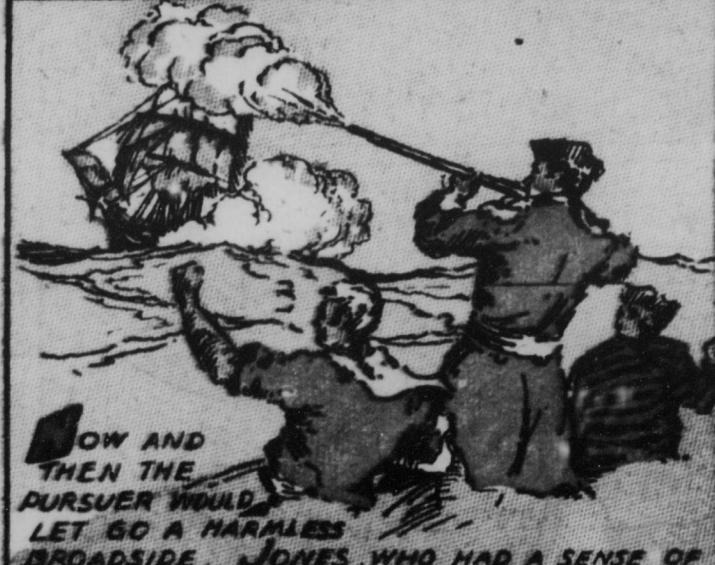

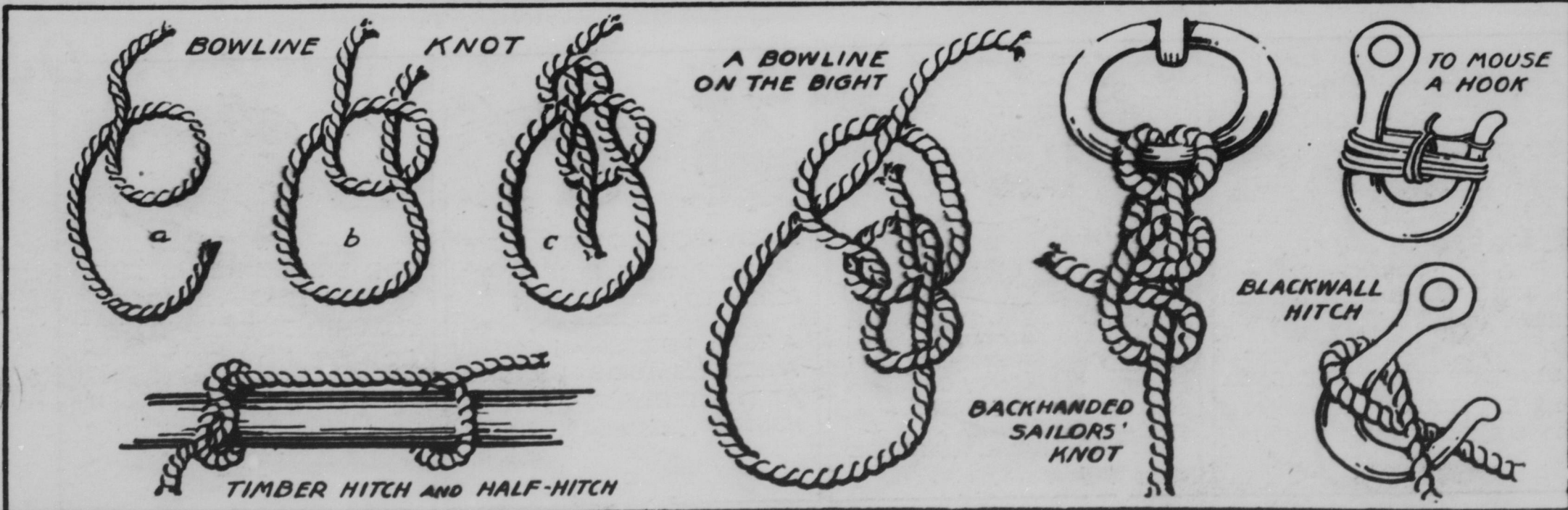
