


## WHEAT AND CORN YIELDS IMPROVE AFTER LEGUMES



The illustration above shows the value of legumes in increasing wheat and corn yields. When legumes are grown and harvested for hay, they improve the soil some and a moderate increase in the yields of succeeding crops is noted. When legumes are plowed under, a much bigger increase is obtained. In a series of experiments soybeans increased wheat yields by nine bushels per acre and clover increased corn yields from 18 to 40 bushels per acre and clover increased corn yields from 18 to 40 bushels per acre, said Dean I. ### CASH REPLACES "BINGLES"

Palmer, Alaska — When the U. S. Government transplanted 200 farming families to the rich Matanuska valley, from drought-ridden Minnesota, Wisconsin and Michigan, the medium of exchange became a token, known as a "bingle", which the Government store accepted in lieu of cash. Since last Fall's crop of 40-pound cabbages, 9-inch carrots and other produce in proportion sold readily elsewhere in Alaska "bingles" will hereafter buy only building material, machinery, live stock and feed. Other commodities command cash.

### CATHOLICS MEET IN ORIENT

Manila, P. I. — The 33rd International Eucharistic Congress, at which 500,000 Roman Catholics of all colors knelt in adoration of the Holy Eucharist, is the first congress ever held in the Far East, and also the first at which an American prelate ever served as the Pope's personal representative, the honor falling to Dennis Cardinal Dougherty, Archbishop of Philadelphia.

### MRS. MCKIMMON RESIGNS

Following her declared purpose of resigning her position as leader of Home Demonstration work in North Carolina, Mrs. Jane McKimmon has asked to be released from active duty. She will, however, continue to act in an advisory capacity, giving her successor and others the benefit of her enthusiasm and wide experience.

Mrs. McKimmon has done much for the rural women of her state and is most deservedly popular. Her duties will be assumed by Miss Ruth Current, herself a worker of efficiency and with years of practical work to her credit.

### LEVEES HOLDING

To date the levees along the banks of the Mississippi River are holding, though warnings are continually being issued that the crest of the flood has not passed. Rehab-

ilitation progresses in the sections devastated by the Ohio River, where the need for help is still desperate, as thousands are destitute.

Wake county's contributions for flood relief total \$25,000 with large amounts of clothing additional.

### CHILD MARRIAGES BALKED

Nashville, Tenn. — The marriage of a nine-year-old Clinch Mountain girl to a neighbor, 22, revealed that last year the State's age limit on marriages had inadvertently been repealed. The State Senate promptly passed an act prohibiting women from marrying before 14 years.

Seven long-term convicts at Caledonia Prison Farm escaped on Monday morning, taking with them Captain Hinton and Steward Roberts as hostages. Having cut telephone wires, they were not pursued until a trip could be made to the nearest phone. The fleeing men took possession of a car later, forcing its driver, W. H. Willard of Raleigh to accompany them. Willard with Hinton and Roberts was released unharmed at Vass Monday night. The convicts are being diligently sought by officials and were said to have been seen in the vicinity of High Point.

Two convicts who escaped from Camp Polk in Wake County were recaptured on Monday after only a few hours of freedom.
