And the parties will further take

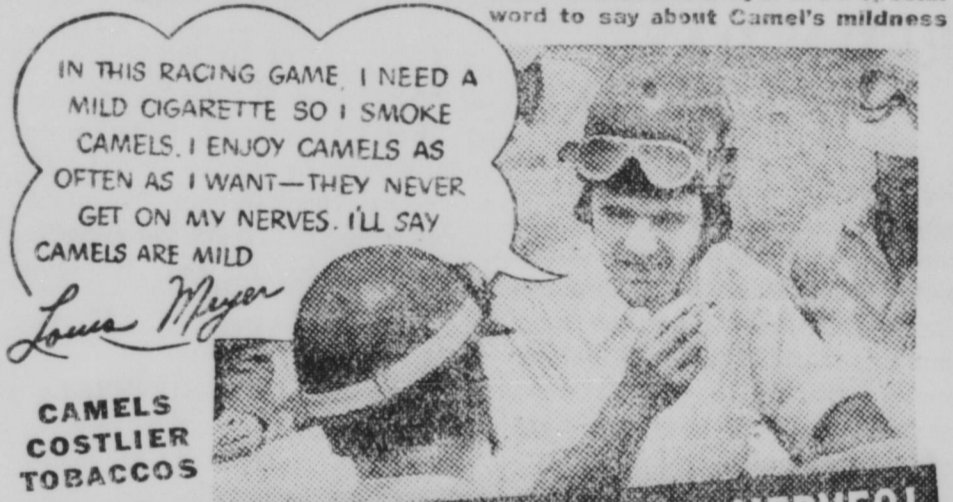

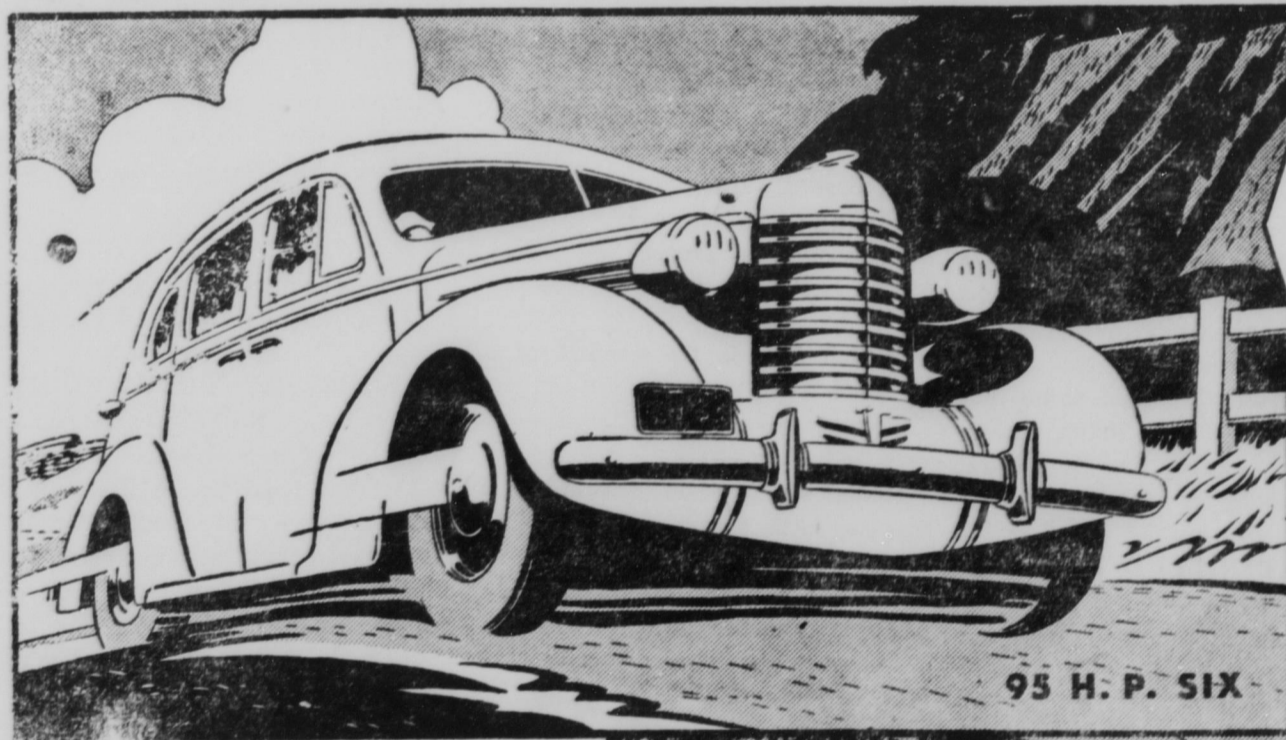

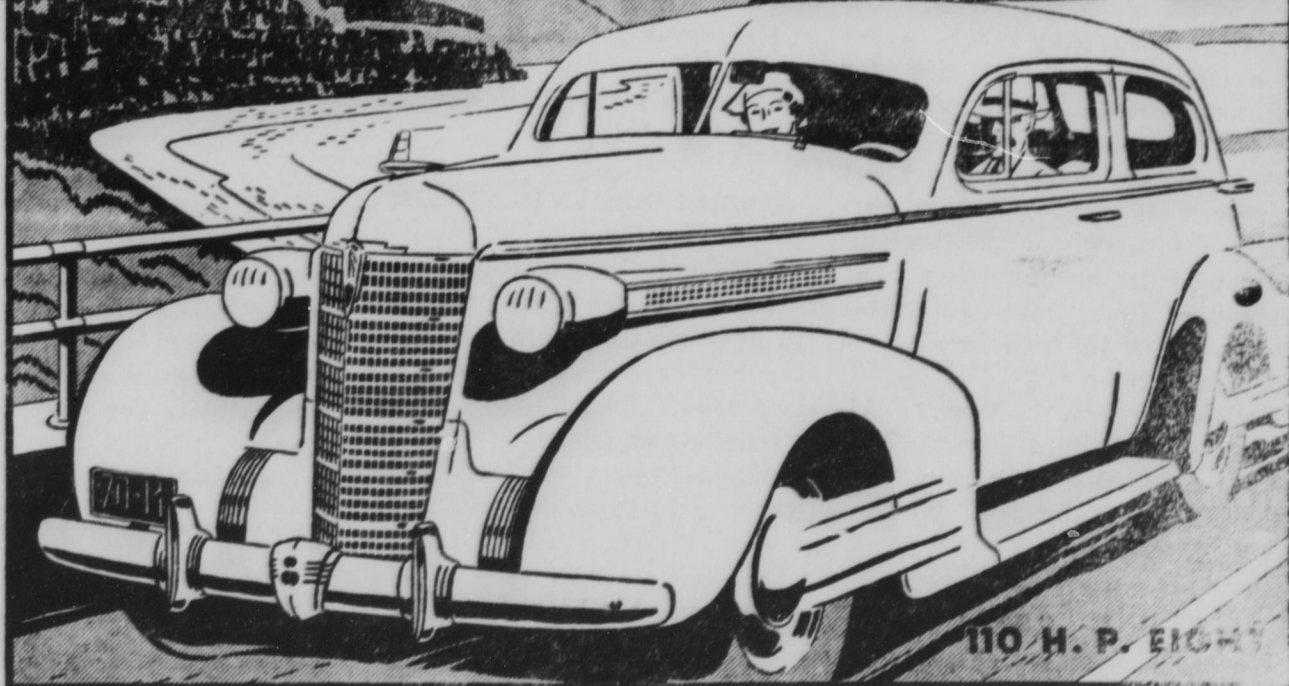
